The following maximum per page transcription rates are established by the Judicial Conference of the United States for transcripts furnished by the Official Court Reporters effective October 1, 2023.

Type of Transcript	Original	First Copy to Each Party	Each Additional Copy to the Same Party
30-Day Transcript (Ordinary) A transcript to be delivered within thirty (30) calendar days after receipt of an order.	\$4.00	\$1.00	\$0.70
14-Day Transcript A transcript to be delivered within fourteen (14) calendar days after receipt of an order.	\$4.70	\$1.00	\$0.70
7-Day Transcript (Expedited) A transcript to be delivered within seven (7) calendar days after receipt of an order.	\$5.35	\$1.00	\$0.70
3-Day Transcript A transcript to be delivered within three (3) calendar days after receipt of an order.	\$6.00	\$1.20	\$0.85
Next-Day Transcript (Daily) A transcript to be delivered on the calendar day following receipt of the order (regardless of whether that calendar day is a weekend or holiday), before the normal opening hour of the Clerk's Office.	\$6.70	\$1.35	\$1.00
2-Hour Transcript (Hourly) A transcript of proceedings to be delivered within two (2) hours from receipt of the order.	\$8.00	\$1.35	\$1.00
Realtime Transcript A draft unedited transcript produced by a certified realtime reporter as a by product of realtime to be delivered electronically during proceedings or immediately following receipt of the order.	One feed, the ordering party pays \$3.40 per page; 2 to 4 feeds, each party receiving a feed pays \$2.35 per page; 5 or more feeds, each party receiving a feed pays \$1.65 per page. Please note: There is no "original" and "copy" rate. Rate is determined by TOTAL number of feeds ordered by ALL parties.		

It is the policy of this Court that in all cases in which a transcript is required for **APPELLATE REVIEW** and is ordered from a court reporter, in the absence of good cause supported by an affidavit, the transcript must be completed and filed with the Clerk of the District Court no more than forty-five (45) days from the date on which any deposit or prepayment required by the reporter was satisfied. The fee charged by court reporters for the appellate transcript shall be reduced by ten (10) percent if it is filed more than forty-five (45) days after financial arrangements have been settled and, if the transcript is outstanding more than sixty (60) days, the reporter shall be entitled to collect only eighty (80) percent of the original fee.
